Special Education Education Assistant (EA) Vacancies

We are currently 4 staff members short in our EA staff. This position is very important to the success of both our moderate needs and severe needs programs. The rate of pay for this position ranges from \$17.62/hour to \$26.29/hour with a maximum hire rate of \$21.96/hour. A high school diploma or the equivalent is required for this position. This position is eligible for full time benefits and the benefits are outstanding. In addition, this position mostly follows the student school calendar so breaks and vacations closely match students' time away from school. Open House

Safety

During school days and times, all visitors must stop by the office prior to moving into the body of the school. Most of the time, our office staff is able to help our visitors with whatever they need right there! We know some parents want to walk their child to class, help them hang up their backpacks, and get organized for the day. As a parent, I completely understand. Our teachers and staff are also trying to build independence with our students and allowing our team to help build that capacity with our students is certainly appreciated. If you anticipate your child will struggle to start the day, please reach out to our counselor or their teacher.

Income Eligibility for Support

This year, students throughout Colorado will not have to pay for breakfast or lunch. This may lead some families to not apply for the "free lunch" program that they have used in previous years. However, applying for this program provides assistance to families beyond meals. This program also provides relief or forgiveness for all school fees. Without applying and receiving approval, families will be responsible for all school fees including transportation costs. If you need assistance applying for this program, please contact our front office staff.

School Attendance

School is a dynamic place for learning. Teachers make plans for every lesson every day and they make adjustments to the lessons based on the real-time feedback from students. The conversations kids have cannot be replicated which makes attendance each day incredibly important. When students are absent we often get requests from parents for makeup work or worksheets to offset absences. If teaching and learning were that simple, you would not need







us! Douglas County School District's policy for attendance states a student is considered truant after 4 unexcused absences in a month or 10 absences in one school year. Please talk with your child's teacher if they are going to be absent as well as our registrar, Gennesa Lowry. We really want your kids to be at school every day!

Parent Involvement

We have two parent groups that are open to all parents. Our Parent-Teacher Organization (PTO) and our School Accountability Committee (SAC) meet quarterly and last year we combined these meetings.
